
Greetings & Namaste,







Kirtan Radio Show in Tucson




Kirtan Cafe is on the air with kirtans, bhajans & more!



"Spring is a season universally liked because it is neither too hot nor too cold and the flowers and trees blossom and flourish. In spring there are also many ceremonies commemorating Krsna's pastimes; therefore this is considered to be the most joyful of all seasons, and it is the representative of the Supreme Lord, Krsna." *Bhagavad-gita* 10.36 purport)

From Srimad-Bhagavatam commentary:





"Madhava normally indicates Krsna to be 'the Lord, who is the consort of the goddess of fortune, Laksmi.' This name also implies that Lord Krsna descended in the dynasty of Madhu. Since the spring season is also known as Madhava, it is understood that as soon as Lord Krsna entered the Vrndavana forest, it automatically exhibited all the opulences of spring, becoming filled with flowers, breezes and a celestial atmosphere. Another reason Lord Krsna is known as Madhava is that He enjoys His pastimes in *madhu*, the taste of conjugal love." (*Srimad-Bhagavatam* 10.15.2 purport)
